

#### **Reminders!**

Tip the hood daily. Fueling is a good time as there is nothing else to do. Check oil, antifreeze, power steering fluid, windshield wash fluid, belts & hoses, look at tires. Only item you need to touch would be checking oil. Otherwise everything else is by sight.

#### 2020 ACCIDENTS:

I have been extremely disappointed with the accidents that we have had this year. The majority of these accidents should never have happened other than for drivers being extremely careless. Unfortunately, it is the few that seem to continue to have the incidents. On every truck door are the words, "DRIVEN PROFESSIONALLY". What that is stating is that as you start your day and every time you are climbing into that truck, you have a professional attitude and operate accordingly, ALL THE TIME! In one incident, a driver was backing into a parking space, failed to look, even though on every truck we have what our GOAL is. This resulted in a claim of over \$13,000.00. Another driver backing up at a truck stop failed to follow the same procedure and took out fuel pumps to the tune of \$14,000.00. Our latest was a result of driving in bad conditions and, rather than getting off the road, continuing to drive. Result was going off the road into the ditch. We are over \$64,000.00 and still climbing! These are just a few and they should never have happened. There is no excuse for them to happen. Careless, inattentive driving is why they happened. You should always be driving defensively, anticipating the worst. Several of these should have only taken a moment to prevent, by Getting Out And Looking! Others by driving defensively and making the correct decisions. GOING FORWARD, LETS MAKE THE CORRECT DECISIONS.

### FUELING:

We have some new drivers and I wanted to remind everyone The Flying J is our fuel stop of choice. Based on the gallonage that we buy from the Flying J our discounts can rise or fall. I have seen in recent months that we are fueling more at the Kwik Trips. Although the pricing is similar, we are pulling gallons away from the Pilot /Flying J's which will ultimately impact our rate of discount. I am requesting that drivers use the Kwik Trip stations as their second choice. Primary fuel suppliers should be the PILOT/ FLYING J. If you are coming in from Wisconsin or Illinois stop at **Roberts** to fuel. I will be monitoring the purchases in the next several months to make sure everyone is doing their best to use the Pilot Flying J's. I appreciate your cooperation. We will advise you of new locations.

# Driver Updates: IDLE TIME:

This is the time of year when you can maximize your fuel economy by shutting of the truck. The days and nights are cool so there is not a need to idle the truck at all. August we saw almost 3400 gallons used while idling. With the national fuel average of \$2.40 per gallon this would equate to over \$8000.00 used to idle the trucks. Shut the trucks off at night and in the docks. The majority of drivers are complying and I appreciate the efforts. To others it may just be a habit that needs to change. And extra blanket in the bunk or small fan may suffice to keep you comfortable. This \$8000.00 per month can amount to over \$90,000.00 a year! I think we can all do a better job!

#### **RUDE YARD:**

This is a reminder that when you are leaving the **RUDE** yard in Eagan on the weekends that you <u>shut and lock the gate</u>. I live within a few miles of the yard and drive by there frequently. Over the past several weekends I have found the gate open, unlocked! There has been an increase of crime in the area and it is imperative that we have the gate locked and the yard secure. The gate is locked by Rude employees after 10PM on Friday and not opened until they come in at 11pm on Sunday. During the weekend the gate should be locked. **MAKE SURE YOU ARE LOCKING THE GATE WHEN YOU LEAVE!**
