Reminders!

Tip the hood daily. Fueling is a good time as there is nothing else to do. Check oil, antifreeze, power steering fluid, windshield wash fluid, belts & hoses, look at tires. Only item you need to touch would be checking oil. Otherwise everything else is by sight.

SOME SAFETY POINTERS:

Watch the bridge decks this time of year. As temps drop bridge decks can look dry but in fact are iced over. The warm concrete or black top does not have the warm ground to keep it from freezing but rather has the cold air from underneath. The condensation on the surface quickly freezes and can cause "black" ice. Make sure you are not on the accelerator or in cruise in this situation. Slow down when approaching the bridge, no matter what the time. An ounce of prevention can be worth thousands of dollars in wrecked equipment!

GOAL – GET OUT AND LOOK:

We will be renewing our insurance policy beginning December 1st, 2020. We are in the process of receiving quotes on our new insurance rates for 2021. We had several backing up incidences or accidents that should not have happened if those individuals followed the advice we have on your review mirrors. Everyone has this on their review mirrors! It does not mean "GO AL"! It does not mean Great Opportunities Are Languishing!" What it means is "**GET**

OUT AND LOOK!" Get Out And Look where & what you are backing into! Get Out and Look to make sure there is no one behind you! Get Out And Look to make sure you can enter and exit safely and properly. Get Out And Look to make sure your lights are working, king pin is hooked, dollies are full up, trailer is sealed! Take the extra minutes to follow these instructions. If you are not familiar with the location you are entering or exiting these extra minutes can save tens of thousands of dollars! I would like to see these incidences eliminated in 2021!

INDUSTRY NOTES:

Our industry has been working on legislation to improve the hours of service rules and although we were close to a change, lawsuits from certain groups were able to delay these improvements until possibly next year. For several years there has been discussions in Congress to increase the fuel tax which most in our industry support "IF", and this is the big "IF" the additional funds are earmarked totally for roads and bridges! Congress has a habit of increasing taxes and then at the same time increasing their pork projects such as bike paths, walking paths and light rail to name a few. ATA has identified over 100 highway bottle necks that greatly reduce our productivity, 5 being here in the Twin Cities, that need to be changed. Congress needs to act but they have failed to address these real issues, instead focusing on fiction! Hopefully after the election, some of these projects will see the light of day!

FUELING:

The Flying J will begin blending fuel when the temperatures reach the range of 5+ to 15+ degrees. What you should begin to do as of the 1st of December is make sure your winter fronts are on. The newer engines need to run at the warmer temperatures and by doing so will generate less carbon build up in the exhaust filters. Additives should not be run until Temps are below -5° F. Blended fuels should be enough unless the windchill is very severe. When you find yourself in a warmer temperature this winter, make sure to drain your air tanks. This will reduce the moisture content in the tanks that are going back into the airline of the trailer. If everyone does this on a regular basis, we will have less frozen brakes this season. If you find yourself in the south and heading north, make sure you are buying blended fuel as you get North to prevent freeze ups. Also, check for new Pilot locations. Again, we try to stay in our network so make sure when you are less than ½ tank you begin to plan your Flying J stop!

HOUSE KEEPING ISSUES:

We have a number of new drivers that have joined our team and we look forward to working with you all. However, because of all the new drivers, I want to remind all of certain protocol regarding performance and expectations. First, we have seen a lot of damage to our equipment at customers where we have drop pools. It is extremely important that you inspect the trailer prior to dropping and send a message on the satellite that the trailer is in excellent condition when dropped ready for the next driver to pick up. You should do the same when picking up a trailer at any of these drop locations.

As we get into fall and next spring, when dropping a loaded trailer in a lot, you should drop it on concrete or make sure there are some kind of blocking underneath. The ground is soft at these times of year and without blocking a trailer or dropping on concrete the pads will sink into the soft ground requiring an expensive tow lift. So, make sure you are dropping on concrete or blocks.

It is also a good time to get ready for winter. Put the flip flops away and the shorts and tee shirts and get your boots, gloves and heavier clothing in the truck. An extra blanket or 2 would not hurt as well.
