ABS On-Road Fix

- 1. At the trailer make sure the brakes are set, you are on flat ground, wearing gloves and you can crawl safely underneath.
- 2. There is a box with 2-4 black cables between the axle wheels under the trailer. Its attached to the underside of the trailer floor.
- 3. Drivers, get under the trailer safely.
- 4. Look up at the box. From underneath feel for a clip on top of the cables. Flip the clip up.
- 5. Then disconnect the cables.
- 6. Take a rag back with you to wipe the road gunk from inside the connectors.
- 7. Reconnect and flip clip back down.
- 8. Careful not to bump your head when you are getting out from underneath.

This fixes the ABS 9/10 times. If the ABS light stays on, call dispatch to route truck in.

Brake Focused Inspection Spree

The Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance announced its annual Brake Safety Week will proceed as scheduled on Aug. 23-29. Inspectors will be looking for critical out-of-service brake violations, along with other OOS violations.

Checking brake system components is always part of the roadside inspection process; however, inspectors will be paying special attention to brake hoses and tubing during this year's Brake Safety Week to highlight the importance of those components to vehicle mechanical fitness and safety.

CVSA says hoses and tubing must be properly attached, undamaged, without leaks and appropriately flexible.

During the 2019 International Roadcheck inspection blitz, brake system and adjustment violations accounted for 45.1% of all OOS violations. During last year's Brake Safety Week, 13.5% of all trucks inspected had brake-related violations and were placed out of service.
