The travel time between origin and destination may increase due to increased traffic, particularly on Fridays and Sundays; It's construction season! Road closures and reduced lanes will add to our increase in travel times. Take some time and look at your route. Check with the state's transportation department to make sure your routes are clear. We have had some issues at night with trucks striking deer and possible fatigue. It is important for our risk management that you travel as much during the daylight hours as possible. A deer strike or damage to the truck that creates a \$2500.00 deductible requires the company to generate \$50,000.00 in revenue to pay for this damage. The truck must generate 2 ½ months' worth of work to reach that level of revenue. Furthermore, if you are not required to be out on that road at the time, it will be considered a chargeable accident. So, stay alert and drive during the day. Enjoy the view!

# **REQUIRED MONTHLY TRAINING**

Starting this month, there will be ongoing training each month. Training will be assigned through Tenstreet and can be accessed through Driver Pulse App (see links below), or by visiting <u>this website</u>.

Training will be targeted at 30 minutes each month covering a range of topics. You will be paid \$10 upon completion of the month's training.

# **BROKER LOAD TRACKING**

When we broker loads to get you where you need to be, the brokers require that the load is tracked. This is done primarily but not exclusively through 2 apps – Trucker tools and Macro point.

The broker will send a link and a code to link the load to you. You must accept and stay on tracking while you are dispatched on the load. This means the app cannot be closed – it can just run in the background.



If you shut the application down and we are fined- the

fine will come out of your check.

This tracking is REQUIRED BY ALL SHIPPERS – it is not a suggestion.

# SPRING THAW & ROAD BANS

Watch when dropping



trailers or parking on dirt/gravel lots unless you are familiar with the location. Wisconsin has started road bans in the throughout the state on county trunks and state highways. It's a seasonal thing (fall & spring). Other states have similar practices.

Make sure that you are extra cautious of any shoulders and soft spots. Make sure that if you are dropping a trailer that you aren't putting the landing gear into a mud pit for the next driver!

Watch for potholes. Plowing, salting, harsh weather, and temperature fluctuations can lead to large potholes. Do your best to watch for these and avoid them.

April is the rainiest month throughout the country, but temperature fluctuations can turn that rain into freezing rain quickly. Make sure that your windshield wipers are in good condition and that you are driving in safe conditions. If you need new ones, buy them with your EFS card.





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### **SPRING CLEANING**

Take advantage of the warmer weather and give your truck a good clean out. Remove any trash and debris gathered over the winter. Pretty soon you'll be able to safely remove heavy jackets and other winter essentials.



If you are in a Penske unit you can get your truck washed at a Penske location. If you are in a Company truck, you can get your unit washed at a Blue Beacon location.

Changing temperatures also means changing tire pressures. This is yet another reminder to check every tire every time to ensure proper inflation. Improper inflation can result in blowouts and failed roadside inspections.

#### EQUIPMENT

We have many new drivers this year and we want to remind all drivers that we have seen an increasing amount of damage to our equipment that has been dropped at various locations.



It is imperative that you not just look at the equipment but **INSPECT** the equipment that you pick up. We recently had a wrapped trailer that was dropped at Perham because of severe damage to the cross members on one of our newer trailers. These repairs come off our bottom line and take away funds for other needed expenses like driver wages and bonuses! You must not just look at the equipment but as part of your pre-trip inspection, **INSPECT** the equipment whether during the day or night, all around the equipment, doors, roof rails, bottom rails, tires, corner radius, cross members, etc.!

# IS IT BROKE? FIX IT!

If you do an inspection and find that there is an issue with your unit, get it fixed at a truck stop. This includes lights, tires etc. If you need an EFS code, call dispatch and get one. Do not leave it for the next driver.

Starting in April, a bad roadside with forfeit your entire bonus for the month. That means up to \$650 lost. Don't let your hard work go to waste. Inspect the equipment every single day. Our CSA Scores must improve, or it costs everyone money.
