The International Roadcheck is this month and will focus on ABS and Cargo Securement. Inspectors will be looking for ABS lights illuminated in transit and malfunctioning lights. They will also verify that all cargo is properly secured.



We've had issues with these in the past, so be proactive and notify dispatch of any issues with ABS so that they can get corrected before they are under a microscope this month!

DOOR LATCHES

If you are pulling a 3V1500 series trailer, make sure that the door latch is functioning so that the door doesn't swing open. Several of these have

gone bad and we have replaced.

If it needs replacement, send in a message so that we can have a new latch installed. If it is not functioning properly, do not just hope that it doesn't hit anything. Find another way to secure it to prevent damage like this:

SPRING CLEAN YOUR HVAC

While the warmer weather is most likely a welcome relief for cold fingers and toes, it places fresh demands on vehicle systems previously coping with the cold.

The HVAC system is switching roles.

With warmer weather emerging, the HVAC sub-systems and components that helped keep the cold at bay need some attention. Here are some tips to keep the system in peak performance:

- Inspect drive belts for wear or damage.
- Inspect the A/C compressor, lines, and hoses for leaks or damage.
- Inspect mountings for damage as well as loose or missing mounting fasteners.

 Inspect the heater, bypass and radiator hoses for seepage, stiffness or cracking, oil leak damage or any damage resulting from rubbing against another component.

There are a few more HVAC areas that may be overlooked at times but need attention to keep the system operating in top shape. These include:

- Inspect the condenser for debris blocking air flow. Dirt, leaves and other junk blocking the airflow through the condenser reduces the efficiency of the air conditioner. In addition, make sure the condenser fins are not bent to the point of blocking air flow.
- Inspect the HVAC drains to be sure they are clear and allow condensation to drain. Drains that are not working properly could result in some unwelcome cab interior scents.
- Inspect the cabin air filter, if equipped. As Spring emerges, critters tend to look for new places to establish a nice warm and comfortable home. The piping and cabin filter housing makes for an ideal home. Even if the mice and rats have not moved into the neighborhood, the filter still needs to be inspected and replaced if needed as the pollen

and dust connected with Spring and Summer emerge.

• Inspect the electrical wiring and connectors for damage. If connector locks are broken the connections could work loose causing an intermittent condition.

While the HVAC system likely goes unnoticed when operating correctly, it becomes the center of attention when it fails to perform. Comfort may be taken for granted, but it takes a little effort to stay that way. If you aren't sure what to look for, make sure to have it looked at when you're in for service.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Your wellbeing is likely one of your top priorities and for good reason! If you're not healthy you can't enjoy many of the things you've worked for. Working as an over-the-road driver can make it difficult to live a well balanced life, but some effort can make sure you stay on the right track.

This can be as simple as getting out and going for a walk while on a break, or more involved like going to a gym. At least one driver is a member at a national gym chain. This allows him to get a workout in as well as getting a free shower.
